Topical Management and feeding tips straight from the field

Research continues to show the benefits of correct dry cow feeding, however no system is 100% right. Finding one that works for you is the key.

Personally I believe if the system is simple it tends to work. The key to dry cow feeding would appear to be controlling supplies of good quality forage yet maintaining ad lib forage intake (i.e keeping the rumen 'stretched') and cow condition score.

The point of the dry period is to allow the udder to recover and repair itself as well as making sure correct embryo development takes place. This is a complex balancing act and grass/silage alone cannot supply all these needs. (See table opposite) At Scotmin we have been looking at colostrum quality and quantity which is also influenced by dry cow feeding. As a result Megastart pre calving tubs and Megastart dry cow minerals have been developed.

By providing high levels of trace elements, magnesium and 'MOS' the immune system of the dry cow is optimised. The result is reduced incidence of milk fever, retained cleansings, mastitis and an improvement in colostrum quality by up to 35%. This obviously has a knock on effect with subsequent cow and calf health.

I have had several farmers already comment on this and how well cows have come into milk as a result and that calf health has been noticeably better.

There is no need to over complicate dry cow feeding, keeping it simple really does work!

Now there's something to think about.
